Attendance



Attendance remains a concern currently. Mrs Seaman and Mrs Fearn will continue to meet with Parents when children are in danger of becoming a persistent absentee. However, we are very proud of the number of children who have between 97% and 100% attendance this term and this needs to be celebrated. On 15th December, all children who have attendance of 97% and above will have a special non-uniform day in school as a reward and those who have 100% attendance will have a special movie afternoon reward. Those children concerned will receive an invitation for this reward. We will operate this each term, with the next reward being before the Easter break. This reward is based on 97% -100% attendance across a term, not the year as a whole, therefore if your child's attendance does not fit within this band, they will have a fresh opportunity in January.

Anti-bullying survey

Mrs Chawner and Miss Smith would like to offer their sincere thanks to everyone who has returned the anti-bullying survey and are now able to provide feedback to Parents. The response from Parents was extremely positive with everyone identifying that their children are happy and safe at school. It is clear that Parents feel that all children are welcomed and treated equally irrespective of background. Another key positive identified by parents was that school is extremely inclusive of parents and carers from all ages, religions and ethnicities. It was wonderful to see that Parents feel listened to by school and that any concerns are addressed effectively and that communication is strong. This has been invaluable feedback to support us on the work we are doing to further strengthen all the work we do here at St. Joseph's. Once again, thank you to all who have contributed.
