

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#### **Welcome Back**

## **Synod**

This week you will have received information about the Synodal consultation process. This process is a listening process and we are keen to hear your views on your dreams for our school and Church. #### **Attendance**

Attendance at school in the run up to half term and this week as been significantly below expectations, particularly in some classes. Attendance of 90% or less is classed as persistent absenteeism and may lead to a fine and possible court action. There is a clear correlation between attendance at school and achievement; as we strive to ensure our children achieve the highest possible standards and achieve their unique potential and therefore want to work with all our families to ensure children attend school regularly. The best approach to take with attendance is to establish the expectation that children just go to school every day, unless they are really poorly or there is a compelling reason to be absent. It is vital for us to set up good habits which will ensure that they succeed in their learning and are well trained for the workplace. Whilst there will be some very legitimate reasons for a child to be absent from school, the usual coughs and colds are not a sufficient reason; if your child is unwell in school and needs to go home or seek medical treatment, then we will of course contact you. I would ask for your support in working collaboratively with us to ensure we reduce absenteeism in school.

### **Come and See Assembly**

As we approach the end of our RE topic, children across school will be presenting their learning in Come and See Assembly. This year we have decided that children in Early Years will present a separate assembly. This term, Reception will present their learning on Wednesday 10th November at 3:00pm. Parents of children in Reception Class are most welcome to join us. From next term, Nursery children will begin participating in the assemblies.

Children in Year 2, 4 & 6 will present their Come and See Assembly on Friday 12th November at 2:45pm.
