Key vocabulary

Climate: The long term weather conditions or an area.

Climate Change: Changes in the earth's climate, especially the gradual rise in temperature, as a result of human activity.

Climate Zone: Sections of the Earth that are divided according to the planet. There are 3 main climate zones; polar, temperate and tropical.

Biome: A natural area of vegetation and animals.

Latitude: angular distance is measured from the equator.

Longitude: The lines running vertically around the Earth.

Equator: an imaginary circle around Earth. It divides the Earth into two equal parts: the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere

Tropic of Cancer: the parallel of latitude that is north of the equator

Tropic of Capricorn: the parallel of latitude that is south of the equator Environmental region: areas that are broadly divided by physical characteristics such as raincorest and desert.

Time zones: A region of the globe that observes a uniform standard time County: a geographical region of a country

Desert: is a landscape form or region that receives very little rain



Key knowledge

- Climate zones are areas around the world with a certain pattern of weather.
- The main climate zones are: Tropical, Arid, Temperate, Polar, Continental and Mediterranean.
- The Mediterranean climate is characterised by dry summers and mild, wet winters whereas the Tropical climate is very warm and wet throughout the year.
- Vegetation belts are regions of the world that are home to certain plant species determined by the climate.
- There are give major types of biomes: aquatic, grassland, forest, desert, and tundra.
