

Whole School Attendance this week is 89.7%

Reception- 85%

Year One - 83.7%

Year Two - 94.8%

Year Three-88.4%

Year Four- 92.8

Year Five- 93.9%

Year Six- 95.5%

Well done to year 6 who won our attendance award this week! They enjoyed Milkshake Friday today!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.
