The Anglo-Saxons did not often use maps themselves, but they still gave names to many places. Many of the names they gave to places back then are still the names that we use today. Port = market town stead /sted= place stow / stowe = meeting place holy place ton / tun= enclosed village / farmstead / manor



There were several kingdoms in Anglo-Saxon England, the biggest of which were Wessex, Mercia, and Northumbria.
