

What have we been up to this week at St Joseph's?

Nursery - The children have been talking about the language of more and less up to 5

Reception- The children have been working hard to understand the states of matter when melting ice.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 95.8%

Reception- 92.2%

Year One - 90%

Year Two - 98.8%

Year Three- 95.3%

Year Four- 99.1%

Year Five- 100%

Year Six- 96.6%

Well done to year 5 who have won our attendance award this week and have won Milkshake Monday next week. As they also got 100%, they will get an extra breaktime at some point over the week. Well done children!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.
