

#### Whole school attendance this week is 91.1%

Reception- 88.2%

Year One - 91.9%

Year Two - 88.2%

Year Three- 93.1%

Year Four- 96.9%

Year Five- 95.3%

Year Six- 92.3%

Well done to year 4 who have won our attendance award this week and have won Milkshake Monday after half term.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance


Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years** from school.
