

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 93.5%

Reception- 88.8%

Year One - 95%

Year Two - 91.6%

Year Three- 89.4%

Year Four- 93.1%

Year Five- 98.2%

Year Six- 98.2%

Well done to years 5 and 6 who have won our attendance award this week and have won Milkshake Monday next week.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years** from school.
