

#### **Attendance**

We are seeing an increasing number of holiday request forms handed into school this term. While we are sympathetic to family circumstances and the cost of holidays, a reminder that no holidays will be authorised by school and any absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

Next week, we will be sending invitations to children whose attendance is 97% or above this term to take part in a non uniform day.

Whole school attendance this week is 92.4 %

Reception-94.7 %

Year One - 94.1%

Year Two - 91.6%

Year Three-91.6 %

Year Four- 96.6%

Year Five- 93.3%

Year Six-92%

Well done to year 4 who have won our attendance award this week and have won Milkshake Monday next week. Well done children!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years** from school.
