

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 93.6%

Reception- 95%

Year One - 96.2%

Year Two - 95.5%

Year Three- 94.8%

Year Four- 97.2%

Year Five- 91.5%

Year Six- 92%

Well done to year 4 who have won our final attendance award for this year and have won Milkshake Monday next week.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.
