

We are delighted that we will continue to offer our breakfast club to all children from Reception class upwards for £2 next year. This will start on Wednesday 4th September. If you would like your child to attend, please pre book their place on Arbor. The breakfast club will run from 7:30am.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 88.7 %

Reception-91.6 %

Year One - 80.7%

Year Two - 88.7%

Year Three-85.2%

Year Four- 99.3%

Year Five- 91.8%

Year Six-88.2%

Well done to year 4 who have won our attendance award this week!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years** from school.
