

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 95.5%

Reception- 90.9%

Year One - 97.9%

Year Two - 90%

Year Three- 94.2%

Year Four- 99.3%

Year Five- 99.4%

Year Six- 93.9%

Well done to year 5 who have won our attendance award this week and have won Milkshake Monday next week.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.
