Catholic Life

This area is the core of all that we do at St Joseph's. Our children are nurtured in the Catholic Faith throughout their time in school. They develop their relationship with Christ through prayer, liturgy, encounter and the sacraments. The school works closely with the the local Parish to ensure that the children's understanding of Catholic Life grows with our communities, CMAT family and the Diocese.



2 Faith in Action

Our school believes that our faith comes alive though our works. Our children are encouraged to use their gifts, enthusiasm and generosity to live the message of Christ and support their less fortunate brothers and sisters. Our school supports three charities each year and our children learn about these organisations and how their acts of charity relate to the Gospel teaching.



3 Sports, clubs and activities

We know the importance of maintaining a healthy lifestyle and being active. enabling pupils to find a sport or activity they enjoy, makes it more likely they will continue to be active in their adult life. We want to encourage healthy competition for children or all sporting abilities.



4 Performance, culture and creativity

Our school provides a rich broad curriculum which enables every child to develop a range of skills and qualities. We want to nurture and develop the individual talents of each child by giving them the opportunity to perform, think and work creatively.



5 Visits, trips and play

Our children will have the opportunity to learn more about their faith and the wider word by engaging in a series of visits, trips, residential and play as they journey through the school. The purpose of this is to develop a greater knowledge of the world, to increase independence and to foster a greater love of learning.

Key Stage One

- Plan and lead liturgy, prayer and whole school Celebration of the word
- Pray Lectio Divina



Key Stage Two

Once the children enter key stage two, they prepare for the next stage of their spiritual journey by having the opportunity to take part in the following:

- Preparing for the sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion
- Experience the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
- Lead Lectio Divina and meditation
- Lead a day of prayer for our school community

As their time at school comes to an end, they consider their futures by:


- Visiting a higher education setting
- Met with and interviewed a wide range of industries and careers














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
