Our curriculum

Our curriculum is ambitious for all. Across the school, in all subjects, the curriculum has been designed to develop the independence and responsibility of all pupils ensuring that they are well equipped for future learning.

The curriculum is ambitious and is underpinned by our principle value of providing high quality educational experiences focused on continued improvement in whole school standards.

All curriculum areas begin in the early years and build progressively so that children can transfer knowledge and skills and make links between their learning.

Teachers are knowledgeable and skilled across the school. Specialist teachers are used to teach across school so that children access the highest quality teaching in all areas of the curriculum.

All teachers use ongoing assessments within class, ensuring pupils have a deep understanding of the subject content and that misconceptions are addressed quickly. The careful and skilful use of pre and post-learning challenges ensures that assessment information is used effectively to provide high levels of appropriate challenge and ambition for all.

Pupils have opportunities to recall content through the use of post-learning challenges, end of topic quizzes, Friday challenges, 'knowing and remembering more' starters and innovate challenges. Lesson starters in all subjects allow opportunities for children to recall prior learning that will support them in the lesson and strengthen their knowledge of links in learning.







Our whole school community ensures that Christ is at the centre of all that we do. Across school, tangible links are made to how we can live out the principles of Catholic Social Teaching to ensure that we show love to our neighbours and care for our common home.

Our school is beautifully diverse and we understand that this reflects the world that we live in. We celebrate diversity and teach our children about the protected characteristic and the importance of upholding British values.

We have been successful in working towards the 'Live Simply' award, demonstrating what we can do to support environmental issues and work together with our global neighbours on projects including sustainability.

The Catholic Life of the school permeates every aspect of school and community life. All pupils have a deep sense of belonging and purpose which helps to develop their personal worth. They are proud of their religious identity and very inclusive of others and of other faiths.

Beyond the curriculum

At St Joseph's, we value the uniqueness of all our pupils and establish an ethos that develops the 'whole child'.

Carefully planned experiences, enrichment opportunities and extra- curricular activities are designed to extend their cultural capital and prepare them for life beyond the school.

Developing the whole child

As a school, we offer the children three chances for a residential experience. In year four, this begins as a one night adventure and builds up to a four night stay in year six. All extra curricular activities, visits and visitors into school ensure that all children have the opportunity to learn in a different environment and in a different way.

Our school is proud of its Forest School. All pupils have an opportunity every year to engage with the Forest Schools programme at an age appropriate level as they move through school. Forest Schools is a child-centred inspirational learning process.

It is a long-term programme that supports play, exploration and supported risk taking. It develops confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands-on experiences in our beautiful natural and extensive outdoor learning environment.

Our school offers a breakfast club from 7:30am. This provides children with breakfast and a great range of engaging activities for the children to start their day. Independence is encouraged within the breakfast club as children make their own food and are able to clean their dishes. This development of life skills is something we weave through all that we do at St Joseph's.

As an Outdoor Play and Learning (OPAL) school, we encourage learning at all times of the school day. OPAL is based on the idea that, as well as learning through excellent teaching, our children also learn when they play.

We recognise play as a form of learning and not something that we do between learning. Our OPAL provision at lunchtime is used to improve opportunities for physical activity, socialisation, cooperation, coordination, resilience, creativity, imagination and enjoyment through improved play.

Pupils' personal development is at the heart of the school's work. The school ensures that the curriculum extends beyond the academic.

Achieving full potential and personal development

Pupils' personal development is at the heart of life at St Joseph's.

The Pupil Voice Committees and Head Pupils ensure that the children have the opportunity to drive change and make a difference to the school. Their contributions feed into school development and allow children to feel that their voice is heard. All children are invited to apply to become members of the committees and these are held in high regard by all pupils.

In addition to the work the children do in school in the curriculum, to support them become leaders of the future, children take leading roles across school and know that it is their right to have their voice heard.

In order to provide pupils with meaningful opportunities to engage with views, beliefs and opinions that are different from their own, debates and discussions are held across the curriculum, wherever possible.

The implementation of Voice 21 ensures that all children are given the opportunities and skills to engage with views, beliefs and opinions different from their own.

Our Community

We are proud to recognise our school as the heart of our community. We encourage parents into school and work closely with families and the parish to enhance the sense of togetherness.

Across the school year, we host galleries, express events and assemblies where parents and carers are invited into school and celebrate their children's work and achievements. These are carefully planned throughout the year with all classes involved from nursery to year six.

In addition, we regularly invite parents and carers to reading cafes, baby groups, forest school sessions, stay and play sessions and coffee afternoons.

We recognise the importance of working with families as the first educators of our children and promote this through regular parent workshops where we share how they can support their child at home.

We are very lucky to have support from our PTA, Friends of St Joseph's, who meet regularly and fundraise to support the school.
