CHRISTMAS SEASON (White/Gold)	12 days beginning with Christmas.		Birth of Jesus Christ. Symbol of purity, joy and truth. Used for seasons and days of the Church Year relating to our Lord.
EPIPHANY DAY (White)	January 6		Visit of the Three Kings. Used for seasons and days of the Church Year relating to our Lord. such as Christmas, Easter, Epiphany, and Ascension, Trinity Sunday and Transfiguration. White is also used for saints other than martyrs, for Holy Baptism, the celebration of a Marriage and the Burial of the Dead.
EPIPHANY SEASON (Green)	"Ordinary" Time between Epiphany and Ash Wednesday		The Ministry of Christ. The universal color of revelatory experience. Celebrates Christ's revelation as the Incarnate God. Symbolizes hope, life, growth and nature.
