

We have been thinking about our mission statement: Trusting in God; Creating Tomorrow; Helping Today and how we can live this out in our daily lives.





What have we been up to this week?

Nursery- The children have been learning about who lives in our house and the Creation Story.

Reception- The children started their new topic all about growing this week and have been drawing members of their family.

Year One- The children have been looking at Andy Goldsworthy sculptures in art and have been thinking about their families.

Year Two- The children have been learning about place value in maths and about their local area in geography.

Year Six-98.5%

Well done to Reception who have won our attendance award this week! They will enjoy Milkshake Monday next week!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.

The window for secondary school applications is now open for our year 6 pupils. The deadline for secondary school applications for 2025 is 31 October 2024. This applies to children who were born between September 1, 2013 and August 31, 2014, and are in their final year of primary school. To apply for your place you need to apply via your home council.
