

Whole school attendance this week is 94.9%

Reception- 99.3%

Year One - 95.3%

Year Two - 85.2%

Year Three-92.2%

Year Four- 96.5%

Year Five- 98.7%

Year Six-99.4%

Well done to Year 6 who have won our attendance award this week! They will enjoy Milkshake Monday next week!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years** from school.

Secondary School Applications

The window for secondary school applications is now open for our year 6 pupils. The deadline for secondary school applications for 2025 is 31 October 2024. This applies to children who were born between September 1, 2013 and August 31, 2014, and are in their final year of primary school. To apply for your place you need to apply via your home council.
