

Catholic Life and Mission

What a busy week for Catholic Life and Mission this week!

As today is the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, we have come to the end of the Season of Creation. During this month, we will be dedicating time to the Holy Rosary. Each class has a travelling rosary that children can bring home to pray with their family. On Monday, we will be asking Mary to pray for peace around the world. The children will all take part in a peace prayer in school and will be thinking of ways that they can live out our Catholic Social Teaching Principle, Promoting Peace.

October is also Kindness Month. This week we launched a kindness challenge across school and considered ways that we can show kindness in our everyday actions.

This week year 6 celebrated a beautiful Mass in church to mark the Feast of St Teresa while the rest of the school enjoyed a celebration of the word to mark this day. The window for secondary school applications is now open for our year 6 pupils. The deadline for secondary school applications for 2025 is 31 October 2024. This applies to children who were born between September 1, 2013 and August 31, 2014, and are in their final year of primary school. To apply for your place you need to apply via your home council.

Whole school attendance this week is 95.1%

Well done to year 5 who won our attendance award this week and will enjoy milkshake Monday next week!

Letters have been sent home today regarding attendance. It is essential that children come to school whenever possible so that they do not miss any learning time.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.

Well done to Reception have won the attendance award this week and will get milkshake Monday next week! Well done!
