

We are delighted to offer our breakfast club to all children from Reception to year 6 for £2. If you would like your child to attend, please pre book their place on Arbor. The breakfast club will run from 7:30am with last entry being at 8:15am.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 95.6%

Reception- 95.9%

Year One - 95.2%

Year Two - 93.7%

Year Three-91.9%

Year Four- 97.1%

Year Five- 96.8%

Year Six-97.1%

Well done to year 4 and 6 who won our attendance award this week and enjoyed an extra playtime.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**

Well done to the 60 children across school who achieved 100% attendance this term!
