

Catholic Life and Mission



We celebrated the Feast of the Epiphany this week in school and thought about how we can share the gift of Jesus Christ with others.

We have been looking at our Mission Statement, what this means and how we can live this out in our everyday actions, words and decisions.

Year 2 and 4 planned and presented a beautiful Celebration of the Word in church this week.

What have we been up to this week?

Nursery- The children have been welcoming the new starters into nursery and have started their, 'Once upon a time' topic.

Reception- The children have been reading the story of, Goldilocks and been learning the phase three sounds, ee, igh and ow.

Year One- The children have been reading the story of, Rapunzel and been learning about 3D shapes.

Year Two- The children have been thinking about how reading makes them feel and what and where they like to read.

Year Three- The children have been learning to estimate in maths and about different types of rocks in science.

Year Four-The children have been learning about area in maths and plagiarism in computing.

Year Five- The children have been learning how to order fractions with different denominators in maths.

Year Six- The children have been learning how to simplify fractions.

We are delighted to offer our breakfast club to all children from Reception class upwards for £2. If you would like your child to attend, please pre book their place on Arbor. The breakfast club will run from 7:30am. Please note that the last entry to Breakfast club is 8:15am. No children will be allowed in after this time.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 97%

Reception- 98.3%

Year One - 94.6 %

Year Two - 98.9%

Year Three-96%

Year Four- 96.8%

Year Five- 100%

Well done to Year 5 who have won our attendance award this week! They will enjoy our attendance reward, Fresh Air Friday. Each child will also achieve a dojo for getting 100% as a class.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**

Created and loved by God week

Next week, we have our annual 'Created and loved by God' week. During the week, we will be thinking about how God made us all in His image and likeness and how we are beautifully unique. We will also be thinking about our aspirations and how we want to make the world a better place and what type of job the children might want.

On Monday, children are invited to come into school dressing in something about them. This may be a hobby, their favourite colour, animal or something about their culture.

On Friday, children are invited to come dressed in what they want to be when they grow up. Please do not feel this needs to be a bought costume, homemade would be great!

The window for primary school applications is now open for September 2025 starters. If your child was born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021 you should apply for their infant or primary school place by 15 January 2025. You'll be able to apply from 11 November 2024. To apply for your place you need to apply via your home council.
