

Catholic Life and Mission

Another wonderful week for Catholic Life and Mission at St Joseph's. On Tuesday, year 1 led a beautiful Liturgy of the Word in church, on Wednesday, year 5 class led the whole school in prayer and today, years 2 and 4 led a wonderful Celebration of the word in church.

Next week is a busy week in school as we enter the Holy Season of Lent on Wednesday. On Tuesday we will be celebrating Shrove Tuesday with Mardi Gras. All children are invited to come into school dressed in bright clothing for the celebrations.

What have we been up to this week at St Joseph's?

The children in Nursery have been learning how to identify bigger and smaller objects.

Reception- The children have been reading, 'The Three Little Pigs', and have been making their own houses of straw, sticks and bricks.

Year One- The children have been learning about past tense verbs in English and about the Wright Brothers in their history of flight unit.

Year Two- The children have been building their own lighthouses that they designed themselves.

Year Three- The children have been learning about division in maths and about pronouns in English.

Year Four- The children have been learning about auxiliary verbs to make questions.

Year Five- The children have been learning about non-finite clauses in English.

Year Six- The children have been learning how to convert fractions into decimals.

We are delighted to offer our breakfast club to all children from Reception to year 6 for £2. If you would like your child to attend, please pre book their place on Arbor. The breakfast club will run from 7:30am with last entry being at 8:15am.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 96.4%

Reception- 100%

Year One - 94.4%

Year Two - 97.5%

Year Three-95.1%

Year Four- 93.1%

Year Five- 97.7%

Year Six- 97.8%

Well done to reception class who won our attendance award this week and enjoyed an extra playtime.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
