

A wonderful week living out our Catholic mission this week.

Our classes have been taking part in their Big Lent Walk this term. Year 3 and 4 did a great job this week. We will be collecting in sponsor forms and money on Thursday 3rd April and the class with the most sponsorships and money raised will be awarded a prize.

This week, we also celebrated St Joseph's Day with a beautiful Mass and prayer reflections throughout the day.

On Wednesday, we were joined by CAFOD who worked with every class to look at how we can celebrate the Jubilee year and how we can all be pilgrims of hope.

Year 5 went on pilgrimage to St Philip Neri church this week. The children were very respectful during their visit and were great ambassadors for the school showing the St Joseph's Way.

What have we been up to this week?

Nursery - the children have been reading Jack and the Beanstalk and have been learning about tall and short.

Reception- the children have been reading Noah's Ark to help them learn about pairs and odd and even numbers.

Year 1- the children have been learning about how we celebrate the Last Supper in the Eucharist in Mass.

Year 2- the children have been learning about multiplication in maths and about Arctic explorers in history.

Year 3- the children have been learning about perimeter in maths and have been learning about Ancient Greek warfare in history.

Year 4- the children have started their work on factors in maths and have been thinking about the parts of Mass in RE.

Year 5- the children have been learning about the story of Zacchaeus in their RSHE work.

Year 6- the children have been looking at ratio in maths and have started to look at different styles of questions in SATs.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 94.7%

Reception- 98.6%

Year One - 92.3 %

Year Two - 92.7%

Year Three-94.7% Year Four- 95.2% Year Five- 94.4% Year Six-98.5%

Well done to Reception class who have won our attendance award this week! They will enjoy our attendance reward, Fresh Air Friday.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
