

Nursery - the children have been reading The Three Little Pigs and have been thinking about measurement in maths work.

Whole school attendance this week is 96.6%

Reception- 98.3%

Year One - 91.3 %

Year Two - 96.7%

Year Three-96.9%

Year Four- 95.5%

Year Five- 99.4%

Year Six-98.2%

Well done to Year 5 who have won our attendance award this week! They will enjoy our attendance reward, Fresh Air Friday.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
