

The breakfast club will run from 7:30am. Please note that the last entry to Breakfast club is 8:15am. After half term, all children must be booked onto breakfast club. Any children not booked on will not be allowed to enter the club.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 96.9%

Reception- 98.3% Year One - 95.5 % Year Two - 96% Year Three-98.8% Year Four- 95.8% Year Five- 96.3%

Year Six-98.5%

Well done to year 3 who have won our attendance award this week! They will enjoy our attendance reward, Fresh Air Friday.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
