

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### **End of Term**

We have enjoyed a wonderful term at St Joseph's school. It has been a very short but busy term and the children have all worked exceptionally hard and have earned a well deserved break next week. Today is the last day of school this term and school will reopen to all pupils on Monday 2nd June for our final term of this academic year. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our parents who have supported us this term and we look forward to a successful end to the school year next term.

### **School Uniform**

We are hopeful that the weather will continue to improve throughout next term and wanted to remind parents about summer uniform at St Joseph's. At St Joseph's we pride ourselves on our uniform and after parental consultation have changed elements of our uniform in previous years. We appreciate your support when making sure that your child comes to school in appropriate uniform in line with our policy.

Children are welcome to come dressed in either winter or summer uniform depending on what they feel comfortable in and what the weather conditions are like outdoors.

Therefore, girls may come to school dressed in either a green gingham dress, green cardigan, white or green socks/ tights and black flat sensible school shoes (not trainers) OR a formal white shirt, school tie, green skirt or pinafore dress or grey straight leg trousers, green cardigan and black flat sensible shoes (not trainers). If girls wish to wear cycling shorts which are shorter than their dresses, they are able to do this.

Boys may wear either grey straight leg trousers or shorts with a white formal shirt, school tie, green jumper, dark coloured socks and black sensible shoes (not trainers).

On PE days, children are invited to come dressed to school in their PE kits. All children should wear the following PE kit:

**Black** joggers, a white polo shirt and a **black** hoodie. In warmer weather, children are welcome to come in **green** school PE shorts. **Please note that these should not be hot pant/cycling short style shorts.** 

On Forest schools days, children may come to school dressed in appropriate forest schools clothing. This does not need to be a particular colour but should be long sleeved and cover their legs.

No jewellery (including earrings) should be worn on PE or forest school days.

In addition, we would like to remind all parents that all hair should be tied back if it is longer than shoulder length. This is for both boys and girls and ensures the safety of all children.

Finally, no make up or false nails should be worn at school. As well as being inappropriate for school, false nails can be unsafe for children when playing and taking part in activities in school.

#### **Attendance**

Whole school attendance this week is 95.9%

Reception- 97.3%

Year One - 93.2%

Year Two - 97.3%

Year Three-96.3%

Year Four- 94.2%

Year Five- 99.1%

Year Six- 95.3%

Well done to year 5 who won our attendance award this week and enjoyed an extra playtime.

Attendance across school has been lower this week. Hopefully, this will improve next week.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
