

#### **Attendance**

Whole school attendance this week is 93.9%. Lots of classes are below National Attendance figures this week. We are hopeful that this will improve next week.

Reception-96.7%

Year One - 91.1%

Year Two - 87.7%

Year Three-94.5%

Year Four- 89.9%

Year Five- 98.5%

Year Six- 94.9%

Well done to year 5 who won our attendance award this week and enjoyed an extra playtime.

Attendance across school has been lower this week. Hopefully, this will improve next week.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
