

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This week at St Joseph's

Another wonderful but very busy week at St Joseph's! The children all spent time in their new classrooms this week getting to know their new teacher. It was great to see the children so excited to be with the new staff. In addition, year 5 and 6 had a road safety workshop and EYFS had a wonderful trip to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park. We then ended the week celebrating lots of children's achievements in our Awards Assembly. A great week at St Joseph's.

Results

All the children across school have worked incredibly hard this year and have achieved great things across the curriculum and beyond. One of the ways these successes are measured is through standardised testing and assessments in Reception class, year 1 and year 6. Although we acknowledge that these results do not fully reflect all of the wonderful achievements of our children, we are very proud to share our outcomes this year.

Reception Class

At the end of the year, children are assessed against the Early Learning Goals. We are pleased to share that 90% of our children met their Early Learning Goal and made a good level of development. This is significantly above the national average of 78%

Year One

At the end of year one, children's phonetical awareness is assessed in the Phonics Screening Test. We are pleased to share that 84% of our children passed the text. Again, this is significantly above the national average of 76%.

Year Six

At the end of year six, children are assessed across the curriculum in the Key Stage Two SATs.

Percentage of children who met the expected standard. (National figures are in brackets.)

Reading, writing, maths combined-76% (62%)

Reading - 79% (75%)

Maths- 91% (74%)

Writing- 85% (72%)

EGaPS - 82% (73%)

Percentage of children who are working above the expected standard. (National figures are in brackets.)

Reading, writing, maths combined- 15% (8%)

Reading - 41% (33%)

Maths- 29% (26%)

Writing- 15% (13%)

EGaPS - 29% (32%)

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 95.9%.

Reception-98.7%

Year One - 91%

Year Two - 94.7%

Year Three-95.6%

Year Four- 96.5%

Year Five- 96.4%

Year Six- 97.4%

Well done to Reception class who won our attendance award this week and enjoyed an extra playtime.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.
