

Please note we are now capping the numbers at Breakfast club. To secure your child's place, please book on Arbor. Only the children booked on will be allowed into the hall.

#### **Attendance**

Whole school attendance this week is 96.3%.

Reception- 96.7%

Year One - 96.5%

Year Two - 96.3%

Year Three-96.6%

Year Four- 96.1%

Year Five- 97.6%

Year Six- 97.9%

Well done to year 6 who won our attendance award this week and enjoyed an extra playtime.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.

Thank you for all your support with attendance this year. We are finishing the school year with a whole school attendance of 95.8% which is above national average and is 1.3% higher than last year!
