

Secondary School Applications

If your child is due to start secondary school in September 2026, parents need to apply for their place at their chosen secondary school place between 8 September 2025 and **31**

October 2025. You can still apply after this date, but your application will be treated as late. You should make your application through your own local authority.

You should apply through Derbyshire County Council if you pay your Council Tax to one of the following councils:

- High Peak Borough Council
- Derbyshire Dales District
- Chesterfield Borough Council
- North East Derbyshire District Council
- Bolsover District Council
- Amber Valley Borough Council
- Erewash Borough Council
- South Derbyshire District Council

If you are applying for a Catholic school, you will also need to return a supplementary form to your chosen school.

We are delighted to offer our breakfast club to all children from Reception to year 6. The cost for this will be £2.50 per child. If you would like your child to attend, please pre book their place on Arbor. The breakfast club will run from 7:30am with last entry being at 8:15am.

We are very excited that we now have a Breakfast Club for Nursery children. This runs from 7:45am in the nursery classroom. If you would like your child to attend, please book them on via Arbor.

Please note we are now capping the numbers at Breakfast club. To secure your child's place, please book on Arbor. Only the children booked on will be allowed into the hall.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is **95.2** % . A reminder that we can administer medication in school if your child is feeling a little unwell but is still able to attend school.

Reception- 90.7%

Year 1- 98%

Year 2- 97.1%

Year 3- 98.7%

Year 4- 95.2%

Year 5- 94.5%

Year 6-94.7%

Well done to year 3 this week who have won our attendance award this week and enjoyed Fresh Air Friday!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.
