

# **Try it Tuesday**

This year, we have been thinking about how we can all eat a healthy diet to keep our brain and body strong and working well. This week the children all had the opportunity to try persimmon fruit. I have been very proud of the healthy snacks and lunchboxes they have been bringing into school.

### What have we been up to this week at St Joseph's?

Please note we are now capping the numbers at Breakfast club. To secure your child's place, please book on Arbor. Only the children booked on will be allowed into the hall.

#### **Attendance**

Whole school attendance this week is 95%.

Reception-94.7%

Year 1-98.7%

Year 2- 91.3%%

Year 3- 94.2%

Year 4-95.8%

Year 5- 94.2%

Year 6-96.5%

Well done to year 1 this week who have won our attendance award AGAIN this week and enjoyed Fresh Air Friday!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.
