

Head Pupils



Our Head Pupils have been busy this week reviewing their action plan and thinking about what they want to achieve this year.

Article of the week- this is an opportunity for the children to look at different articles from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

This week the children have been thinking about Articles 2 and 30 as we consider the importance of no discrimination and we celebrate how unique we all are.

What have we been up to this week at St Joseph's?

Nursery- The children have been making winter collages and learning how to write their names.

Reception- The children have been learning about evergreen trees and reading the story of feeding the 5000.

Year One- The children have been learning about 3D shape names and properties.

Year Two- The children have been building a circuit in DT and have been learning about money in maths.

Year Three- The children have been learning about topographical features in geography.

Year Four- The children have been practicing running stitch to make a seam for their drawstring pouches.

Year Five- The children have been adding and subtracting mixed numbers.

Year Six- The children have been designing their own CAM toys based on WWII.

Homework

At St. Joseph's Catholic Primary Academy, we believe that homework should be a part of our partnership between home and school. We recognise that children who have spent a busy, structured day at school need time to relax and unwind at the end of the afternoon. We are also mindful of the need to encourage children to pursue out-of-school activities such as dancing, sports, music etc. However, we recognise the benefits of homework if this is introduced gradually over the primary years so that children develop as independent learners and are well prepared for secondary school. In addition, this allows children to explore their learning in different ways and present this in their own creative ways.

Any homework will be sent home with children on a Friday. The homework should then be completed and returned to school the following Wednesday. While we encourage all children to complete this as a way of preparing them for secondary school and to support retrieval from learning during the week, we do understand that at times family life is too busy to complete homework. We do not wish to add any additional strain or stress to family life. Therefore, we offer opportunities for children to complete their homework on a Monday or Tuesday lunchtime, if they wish to do so. However, on the rare occasion that children cannot complete their homework, we would encourage parents to write a note in their child's organiser or speak to the office so that the class teacher is aware that the work has not been completed.

If any parents require any support with homework or would like to discuss this further, please contact the school office or speak to your child's teacher who will be more than happy to support with this. A copy of the school's homework policy with more information can be found on the school website.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is **96%** . Attendance has improved again this week. Thank you to all parents for your support.

Well done to year 3 this week who have won our attendance award this week and enjoyed Fresh Air Friday!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = **4 weeks missed per year**

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = **more than half a term missed per year.**

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = **more than a quarter of the school year missed.**

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
