

This weekend there will be a children's liturgy at the 5pm Mass. All children are welcome to attend.

Head Pupils



Our Head Pupils will be meeting with Mrs Seaman and Miss Queenan next week to look at their action plan for the school.

Article of the week- this is an opportunity for the children to look at different articles from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

This week the children have been thinking about Article 29- Aims of Education

What have we been up to this week at St Joseph's?

Nursery- The children have been learning about arctic animals and have been reading, The Gruffalo's Child.

Reception- The children have been learning about seasons and have been subitising to 5.

Year One- The children have been learning how to subtract a number using number lines and ten frames.

Year Two- The children have been looking at prepositional language in English.

Year Three- The children have been using coordinating conjunctions and multiplying by 3.

Year Four- The children have been learning how to use linking adverbs in English.

Year Five- The children have been using semi colons and linking adverbs to join two main clauses.

Year Six- The children have been looking at how they can add relative clauses to a main clause in English.

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is **97.1%** . Attendance has been great in school this week with improved attendance in every class. Thank you for your support with this. All

children have had attendance letters sent home in the this week with their current attendance to date.

Reception- 96.7%

Year 1- 100%

Year 2- 94.1%

Year 3- 100%

Year 4- 99.5%

Year 5- 98.4%

Year 6- 99%

Well done to year 1 and 3 this week who have won our attendance award this week and enjoyed Fresh Air Friday!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = **4 weeks missed per year**

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = **more than half a term missed per year.**

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = **more than a quarter of the school year missed.**

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
