

Article of the week- this is an opportunity for the children to look at different articles from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

What have we been up to this week at St Joseph's?

Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is **95.5%** . After half term, class teachers will be sharing attendance for all children. Any children with improved or concerning attendance will be receiving a letter today.

Reception- 95%

Year 1- 97.5%

Year 2- 99.2%

Year 3- 92.7%

Year 4- 92.4%

Year 5- 96%

Year 6- 98.5%

Well done to year 2 this week who have won our attendance award this week and enjoyed Fresh Air Friday!

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = **4 weeks missed per year**

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = **more than half a term missed per year.**

Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = **more than a quarter of the school year missed.**

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to **missing a whole 2 years from school.**
